- RLGN 2130, Introduction to Christian Ethics, 3 credit hours (offered semester one)**
- RLGN 2150, Hermeneutics: The Practice of Interpreting, 3 credit hours (offered semester one)**
- RLGN 3040, Introduction to Christian Theology, 3 credit hours (offered semester two)**
- RLGN 3420, American Religious History, 3 credit hours (offered semester two)

Ministry Core Courses:

- CMIN 2000, Introduction to Church Ministry, 3 credit hours (offered both semesters) **and,**
3 hours from one of these courses:
 - CMIN 3050, Homiletics, 3 credit hours (offered semester one)**
 - CMIN 3080, Pastoral Care and Counseling, 3 credit hours (offered semester two)***
 - CMIN 3910, Ministry Seminar, 3 credit hours (offered both semesters)***

- BIBL 2000, Introduction to the Bible, is a Biblical Literacy course in the Liberal Arts Program.
- CMIN 3910, Ministry Seminar, meets the Speaking Intensive requirement for the Liberal Arts.
- CMIN 4250, Theology in a Ministry Context, applies to the Liberal Arts upper-division writing-intensive requirement. You could also use this course, perhaps, as an upper-division departmental elective.
