Internship experiences in social agencies are built into SOWK 2100 (36 hours), SOWK 2200 (20 hours), and SOWK 4710 (20 hours). The practicum (SOWK 4850) consists of a full-time block field placement over the entire semester (442 hours).

- PSYC 2440, Applied Statistics/Intro Research, is a Quantitative Reasoning course in the Liberal Arts Program.
- SOCI 2010, Introduction to Sociology, is a Social & Behavioral Ways of Knowing course in the Liberal Arts Program.
- SOCI 2020, Social Problems, is a Social & Behavioral Ways of Knowing course in the Liberal Arts Program.
- SOCI 3700, Introduction to Social Research, is a Writing Intensive course in the Liberal Arts Program.
- SOWK 4850, Social Work Practicum, is a Speaking Intensive course and fulfills the Experiential Ways of Knowing requirement in the Liberal Arts Program.
