

Spanish Complementary Major, 4 Year Plan (30 credit hours)

2018-2019

Students must complete 26 SPAN hours including the following and at least 6 hours of which are earned through an approved study abroad experience:

- SPAN 2020, Intermediate Spanish II, 4 credit hours
- SPAN 3010, Spanish Composition, 4 credit hours
- SPAN 3020, Spanish Conversation, 4 credit hours
- SPAN 3140, Spanish Phonetics, 3 credit hours
- One civilization course, typically:
 - SPAN 3400, Spanish Civilization and Culture, 3 credit hours OR
 - SPAN 3440, Spanish-American Civilization, 3 credit hours
- One 4-hour literature course at the 4xxx level, typically:
 - SPAN 4350 or 4360, Survey of Latin American Literature I or II, 4 credit hours
 - OR
 - SPAN 4370 or 4380, Survey of Peninsular Literature I or II, 4 credit hours
- Other SPAN-captioned coursework beyond 2010 until at least **26** SPAN hours are attained, for example:
 - SPAN 31XX, Spanish for the Professions, credit hours vary
 - SPAN 3200, Advanced Spanish Grammar and Translation, 3 credit hours
 - SPAN 3240, Strategies for Advanced Spanish Proficiency, 1-2 credit hours

Students must also complete:

- FLAN 3500, Study Abroad Experience, 1 credit hour (C/NC)
- FLAN 4900, Senior Seminar in Foreign Languages, 3 credit hours

The proposed course sequence that follows will vary based upon a student's initial language placement, primary major, and decision of whether to study abroad in the summer or during the semester.

NOTE: All students must complete 120 total credits, regardless of major(s), to graduate.
