

Criminal Justice Major (34 credit hours)

The criminal justice major at Anderson University prepares students to enter employment in fields related to law enforcement, courts and corrections, victim advocacy and assistance, and provides a foundation for graduate study. Coursework in the criminal justice program focuses on the social science of criminology and criminal justice.

Major Requirements:

- CRIM 2510, The Nature of Crime and Social Deviance, 4 credit hours
 - CRIM 2520, Introduction to Criminal Justice, 3 credit hours
 - CRIM 3110, Criminal Law and Process, 4 credit hours
 - CRIM 4810, Criminal Justice Internship I, 4 credit hours
 - CRIM 4900, Criminal Justice Seminar, 3 credit hours
 - SOCI 2010, Introduction to Sociology, 3 credit hours OR SOCI 2020, Social Problems, 3 credit hours
 - SOCI 3700, Introduction to Social Research, 4 credit hours
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- 9 hours from additional CRIM Courses

Students who wish to take additional coursework providing more breadth and depth in the field should consult with their advisor concerning the appropriate courses.

- CRIM 2510, The Nature of Crime and Social Deviance, is a Writing Intensive course in the Liberal Arts Program.
- CRIM 4900, Criminal Justice Seminar, is a Speaking Intensive course in the Liberal Arts Program.
- SOCI 2010, Introduction to Sociology, is a Social & Behavioral Ways of Knowing course in the Liberal Arts Program.
- SOCI 2020, Social Problems, is a Social & Behavioral Ways of Knowing course in the Liberal Arts Program.
- SOCI 3700, Introduction to Social Research, is a Writing Intensive course in the Liberal Arts Program.

*Students who are interested in a legal studies minor, law school, or a double major in National Security should take POSC 2100. Students intending to double major or minor in Social Services or Psychology areas could take SOCI 2010.

NOTE: All students must complete 120 total credit hours to graduate from Anderson University.
