Discipleship Coordinator Job Description

Position Summary

Discipleship Coordinators live on predominantly freshmen floors in the resident halls and volunteer their time to invest in the lives of the students on their floor. They encourage, challenge, listen, and provide community to these students as they experience their first year of college. DCs lead weekly Life Groups for the residents on their hall to provide an avenue for spiritual growth.

Distinguishing Characteristics

Every Discipleship Coordinator offers their own unique giftedness, however, it is important to note that in order to be successful in this position, candidates should possess emotional stability, flexibility, maturity, and discernment. DCs are servant-hearted young men and women who have a good understanding of people and relate well to others as they continue to grow in their spiritual walk.

Duties:

- Spend 3-5 hours a week interacting with residents on their floor
- Plan and facilitate a weekly Life Group
- Be available to listen to, love, encourage, and pray for students on their floor
- Meet weekly with their RA to discuss what is happening on their hall and with residents
- Attend bi-weekly staff meetings
- Attend monthly individual meetings with Becca Palmer or the Lead DC
- Complete bi-weekly DC Reflection and turn it into Becca Palmer

Expectations and Responsibilities:

- Attend DC Training
 - o (NOTE: This will take place the week before classes begin in August)
- Attend Student Leadership Training Day
 - o (NOTE: This will occur the week before classes start in August)
- Attend Student Leader Pump Up
 - o (NOTE: This will occur a few days before classes resume in January)
- Meet/exceed chapel attendance requirements
- Have a minimum GPA of 2.5
- Attend Spiritual Emphasis Week and Impact Your World Week chapel services
- Attend monthly meetings with Resident Director and RA staff
- Attend 3 out of 6 of All Hall events
- Continually seek the Lord and grow in your spiritual walk
