FACULTY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Summer 2022

Dr. Brian Dirck shared several recent accomplishments::

- Dr. Dirck lectured at Quincy University (Illinois) as part of their annual Rinella Lincoln Memorial Lecture series. Dr. Dirck's talk was drawn from his book, <u>The Black Heavens: Abraham Lincoln</u> <u>and Death</u>. (Oct. 2021)
- He provided a manuscript review and jacket endorsement for a new collection of Abraham
 Lincoln's speeches, to be published by the University Press of Kansas, as well as a new volume on
 Lincoln's relationship with future Supreme Court Justice David Davis for the University of Illinois
 Press.
- He wrote professional book reviews for the *Journal of the Civil War Era*, *Civil War History*, and the *Journal of the Abraham Lincoln Association*.

<u>Dr. Laura Stull</u> shared several recent accomplishments::

January 2023

Dr. Courtney Taylor reports the publication of a peer-reviewed article, "*Extensions of Rolle's Theorem*" in *Involve: A Journal of Mathematics*. Vol. 15 (2022) with Megan Moran and Laura Batts. The classical Rolle's theorem, typically studied in first-semester calculus, provides some constraints on the ordering of the roots of a polynomial and its derivatives. We use elementary methods to prove several Rolle's-type theorems that further constrain the orderings of the roots of polynomials and their derivatives.

Another publication reported by **<u>Dr. Courtney Taylor</u>** was a peer-reviewed article, "*Infinite Families of Infinite Series With Integer Sums*" in *The College Mathematics Journal* (25 Jan 2023) with James Sellers and Damiano Fulghesu. "We demonstrate a technique to calculate infinite sums using tools often demonstrated to calculus students. We then use these results, which include an explicit formula for the sums in question, to prove the existence of an infinite family of infinite series whose sums are integers."

February 2023

Prof. Christine Colquitt Thacker was accepted as a presenter at the Wayne State University Research Symposium March 6-8 on the topic, "The Case for Sightless Somatic Ballet Practice: Visionless Dance and How it Can Accelerate Technique and Artistry while Alleviating Body Dysmorphia Issues." *educateevolveinspire.com*

Dr. Carolyn Ahn shared several recent accomplishments:

- The Richmond (Virginia) Symphony Orchestra will be performing one of Dr. Ahn's compositions on March 9 and 10.
- Dr. Ahn was one of three finalists for a CMI Lab Commission in Classical Music, which carries a significant financial award.
- Noblesville High School's Director of Bands commissioned Dr. Ahn to compose a new piece for NHS winds and percussion.

March 2023

Dr. Lee Griffith, **Dr. Laura Stull**, and AU Youth Leadership Development (YLD) students provided "Family Conversation Training" to families at a March 6 "Marvelous Monday" community event sponsored by South Meridian Church of God and Sherman Street Church of God. Approximately 80 people in attendance had opportunities to develop skills and engage in meaningful conversations.

Prof. Christine Colquitt Thacker earned a *First Place* finish and a \$1,000 cash prize at the *Wayne State Graduate Post-Doctoral Research Symposium* (GRS) March 6-8 with her platform presentation entitled "*The Case for Sightless Somatic Ballet Study*." Prof. Thacker's research involves a supplemental learning technique for dancers that propels ballet technique forward through critical thinking and internal muscular-skeletal connections, while also aiding in alleviating body dysmorphia in dancers, building speed in choreographic retention, and aiding neuro-divergent students in the dance classroom. There were 180 submissions at this year's GRS, with 1,325 people from 20 U.S. states, 30 countries, and 156 universities around the world attending.

Dr. Laura Stull was invited to give a Grand Rounds presentation for the Northcoast Behavioral Healthcare Network, which is comprised of six state psychiatric hospitals in Ohio. The presentation, titled "Explicit and Implicit Stigma of Mental Illness: Barriers to Recovery" was a live, virtual event presented on Friday, March 10.
