

## Measure 2: Satisfaction of Employers and Stakeholder Involvement

**This set of data aligns to CAEP Annual Report Measure 2: Satisfaction of Employers and Stakeholder Involvement (*Component R4.2, R4.3*).**

Indiana Code (IC) 20-28-11.5-9 requires principals at each school corporation to “complete a survey that provides information regarding the principal’s assessment of the quality of instruction by each particular teacher preparation program located in Indiana for teachers employed at the school who initially received their teaching license in Indiana in the previous two (2) years.” The Indiana Department of Education collects this data and shares the results with each state-approved educator preparation provider (EPP) every August. The survey is aligned to CAEP and InTASC standards and measures employers’ satisfaction with the preparation of new teachers in the categories of professional knowledge, skills, and dispositions. The Indiana Department of Education also collects survey data from novice teachers on their level of satisfaction with the preparation they received from their EPP. This survey is essentially identical to the one given to principals, allowing for comparison of responses. The survey scale is from 1 to 4. Higher numbers indicate a higher level of satisfaction.

The table below represents the 2024 survey results from principals and novice teachers. These ratings and comments inform EPP action regarding early intervention. Principal respondents scored all items as “agree” or “strongly agree,” with an overall assessment of “very satisfied.”

<b>Principal Survey Results for Anderson University</b>				
Principals are responding to statements divided into three domains (knowledge, disposition, and performance) and reflect elements of both national professional standards (NCATE/CAEP) and the Model Core Teaching Standards, Interstate Teacher Assessment and Support Consortium (InTASC). EPPs are expected to meet these standards in order to prepare educators for licensure (511 IAC 13-1-1).
