ABOUT THE INSTRUCTORS



Betsy Carter (Level I) is an Orff Specialist at Snowden School in Memphis, TN. She has served as an Orff mentor, teacher, and curriculum writer for 10 years and currently serves as an AOSA digital mentor. She has taught Level I at Lee University and the University of Memphis. A graduate of the Eastman School of Music, Betsy completed her Orff Levels at the University of Memphis, masterclasses at Trinity University and Anderson University, and her apprenticeship at AU. She is currently the VP of the Memphis Chapter of AOSA and serves on the Diversity and Inclusion Board for the TN Music Educators Assoc.

Lisa Odom (Sullivan) (Level II, Children's Literature) is a

curriculum specialist and music educator with 33 years of experience creating professional development resources and teaching K-5 students. Lisa retired from classroom teaching in 2022. Lisa taught for Carmel Clay Schools for 28 years and K-2 music for Skokie School District 69 for five years. Lisa holds a bachelor's degree from Butler University and a master's from Ball State University. She served three years as the Region VI representative for AOSA and has presented at various AOSA, NAME, and IMEA conferences. In 2017, Lisa was named Elementary Music Teacher of the Year by the IMEA. Lisa teaches Orff courses at Anderson University and DePaul University.



Josh Southard (Level III, Children's Literature) teaches general music at Smoky Row Elementary School in Carmel, IN. He holds a bachelor's degree from Butler University and a master's from Anderson University. In 2018, he was selected as the Teacher of the Year for Smoky Row and in 2019 was honored as the IMEA Elementary Music Teacher of the Year. Josh served as president of the Indiana chapter of AOSA and has served on the AOSA National Board of Trustees. He is a featured clinician at Orff workshops and conferences around the country. He currently teaches Orff in Gwinnett County Public Schools in Atlanta, DePaul University, and AU. He is the author of the book *Sing and Play, Stories All Day* and is the president-elect for AOSA.



Aaron Ford (Movement) teaches elementary and middle school music at The School at Columbia University in NYC. He is a certified Orff Levels I - III Movement Teacher Educator and teaches Orff courses at Anderson University and DePaul University. Aaron leads national and chapter workshops on creative movement and body awareness and has authored related articles in the *Orff Echo* and *Reverberations*. He has a post-baccalaureate certification in music education and a master's degree in creative arts therapy with a specialization in dance/movement therapy.



Meeghan Binder (Recorder) has worked in the Chicagoland area as a public school general music teacher and clinician for 19 years. Meeghan received a bachelor's degree from Northern Illinois University and a master's from DePaul University, where she currently serves as adjunct faculty. In 2013, Meeghan became a certified American Orff Schulwerk recorder instructor and has taught all three levels at various Orff Levels teacher training. Meeghan's musical background includes study in classical flute, recorder ensembles, local choirs, West African drumming, and Japanese Taiko drumming groups. Meeghan is active in her teacher union as an IEA/NEA union president and serves on several committees in her district.



Dr. Joani Brandon (First Steps and Orff) is a K-5 music educator at Red Rocks Elementary and Leawood Elementary in JeffCo schools in the metro Denver area. She is a professor of music, emeritus at Anderson University for 22 years, where she taught choral and general methods courses and served as the director of the summer graduate program. Joani is a member of the AOSA history committee and a past president of the Feierabend Association for Music Education. She is a co-author on *First Steps in Music and Orff Schulwerk (GIA)*.

ABOUT THE COURSES

FIRST STEPS AND ORFF

First Steps in Music is a research-based approach to develop tuneful, beautiful, and artful children. Orff Schulwerk helps tap into the creative nature of children through singing, saying, dancing, playing, and creating. Join us as we learn how to weave these two models together and create experiences for children in the music classroom. Active participation in both music and movement activities will be the basis for most instruction.

CHILDREN'S LITERATURE IN THE ORFF SCHULWERK CLASSROOM

Pre-requisite: Orff Level I

- What to look for when choosing books to use.
- How to create lessons for singing, instruments, improvisation, composition, music literacy, and performances.
- Process teaching.
- Classroom management tips.
- Composing music to your student's abilities.
- Making children's literature a strong part of your curriculum.

ORFF SCHULWERK LEVELS I, II, AND III

Participants will sing, play, move, and improvise using the Orff Schulwerk model. Each level includes classes in pedagogy, movement, recorder, ensemble, and special topics. This approach is based on active learning and developing creative skills in children. These courses are approved by the American Orff-Schulwerk Association.

- Level I: This course is open to all music teachers and senior undergraduate music education students.
- Level II: At least one year of teaching experience is required before taking Level II. If you completed Level I prior to 2016, you will need to re-take Level I.
- Level III: At least one year of teaching experience is required before taking Level III.

TUITION AND REGISTRATION

Tuition for any course you are taking for graduate credit is estimated at \$485 per credit hour. If you take the Level I, II, or III certification program for credit, the cost is \$1,455, and you will receive three hours of graduate credit. If you take Level I, II, or III for no graduate credit, the cost is \$1,065.

If you take Children's Literature in the Orff Schulwerk Classroom for credit, the cost is \$970, and you will receive two hours of graduate credit. If you take Children's Literature in the Orff Schulwerk Classroom for no graduate credit, the cost is \$750.

If you take First Steps and Orff for graduate credit, you will receive one hour of graduate credit, and the cost is \$485. If you take First Steps and Orff for no graduate credit, the cost is \$360.

Online registration is available at anderson.edu/music-studies. For students taking a class for graduate credit: A \$100 nonrefundable registration fee is due at the time of registration, which will be applied toward the tuition cost and will hold your place in the course. The remaining balance is due by the first day of the course. For students taking a class for no graduate credit: The full cost of the course is due electronically at the time of registration.
