The Elementary Education Teaching major is designed to prepare students for teaching in an elementary classroom and meets the licensure requirements for the state of Indiana.

Embedded in the elementary education major is a 12-credit reading concentration that can serve as the required concentration for state licensing. Elementary education majors are also strongly encouraged to complete another minor or concentration such as special education which leads to an additional license area.
